1. GRANTEE: Department of Defense (Military Surface  
Deployment & Distribution Command)  
Scott Air Force Base, IL
2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:
  - a. This special permit authorizes the transportation in commerce of certain DOT specification 3T cylinders that are past their test date for requalification. This special permit provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein. The most recent revision supersedes all previous revisions.
  - b. The safety analyses performed in development of this special permit only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce. The safety analyses did not consider the hazards and risks associated with other uses not associated with transportation in commerce.
  - c. No party status will be granted to this special permit.
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR § 180.209 in that cylinders past their test date may not be filled and offered for transportation, except as provided herein, and § 172.301(c) in that the marking requirements are waived.

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5. BASIS: This special permit is based on the application of Department of Defense (Military Surface Deployment & Distribution Command) dated August 21, 2020, submitted in accordance with § 107.105 and the public preceding thereon.
6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR § 172.101):

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

a. PACKAGING:

(1) Prescribed packagings are (Weldship) tube trailers containing DOT specification 3T cylinders. There are 12 cylinders per tube trailer. The planned requalification dates of these cylinders may be extended by up to five years from the stamped requalification due date. The total extensions applied in accordance with this special permit may not exceed ten years beyond the original stamped requalification date (maximum of 2 five-year extensions). To extend requalification, each cylinder, including the cylinder neck and flange/sleeve must be subjected to an external visual inspection (without disassembly) in accordance with CGA Pamphlet C-6. A cylinder with excessive corrosion around the neck or under the flange/sleeve must be removed and examined in accordance with the DOT procedure for inspection of DOT/TC cylinder mounting threads list on the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration's website at:

(2) The DOD must record the results of the visual inspection for each cylinder or tube and submit the report to the Office of Hazardous Materials Safety Approvals and Permits Division upon request.

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b. OPERATIONAL CONTROLS:

(1) Cylinders authorized for use under this special permit must be used by the DOD in support of national security at OCONUS locations.

(2) The maximum cycling (fillings) of each cylinder (tube) in a 10-year period must be less than or equal to 300 for DOT 3T cylinders.

(3) The gas used must be dry and have a dew point at or below minus 52 °F at one atmosphere.

(4) Each tube (3T), which is authorized for use under the terms of this permit, must undergo an internal visual inspection in accordance with CGA Pamphlet C-6 when the cylinder is requalified.

(5) All Weldship tube trailers deployed to OCUNUS locations must be tracked by serial number and requalification date. Visual inspections conducted for requalification extensions must be documented and maintained by DLA Energy until requalification can be conducted by qualified personnel. Extended requalification date must be stamped on trailer data plate.

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

a. A person who is not a holder of this special permit who receives a package covered by this special permit may reoffer it for transportation provided no modifications or changes are made to the package and it is reoffered for transportation in conformance with this special permit and the HMR.

b. A current copy of this special permit must be maintained at each facility where the package is offered or reoffered for transportation.

c. MARKING: The marking requirements of § 172.301(c) are waived.

9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle, cargo vessel, and cargo-only aircraft.

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10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: A current copy of this special permit must be carried aboard each aircraft, cargo vessel, or motor vehicle used to transport packages covered by this special permit. The shipper must furnish a copy of this special permit to the air carrier before or at the time the shipment is tendered.
11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this special permit and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:
- o All terms and conditions prescribed in this special permit and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
  - o Persons operating under the terms of this special permit must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.
  - o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this special permit must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this special permit in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this special permit, including display of its number, when this special permit has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

Under Title VII of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) - "The Hazardous Materials Safety and Security Reauthorization Act of 2005" (Pub. L. 109-59), 119 Stat. 1144 (August 10, 2005), amended the Federal hazardous materials transportation law by changing the term "exemption" to "special permit" and authorizes a special permit to be granted up to two years for new special permits and up to four years for renewals.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: Shipments or operations conducted under this special permit are subject to the Hazardous Materials Incident Reporting requirements specified in 49 CFR §§ 171.15 Immediate notice of certain hazardous

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materials incidents, and 171.16 Detailed hazardous materials incident reports. In addition, the grantee(s) of this special permit must notify the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety, in writing, of any incident involving a package, shipment or operation conducted under terms of this special permit.
